Dear Sir:

Reference is made to Bureau letter dated April 10, 1942, Bureau File No. 94-4-5663, wherein the San Francisco Field Division was requested to interview Mr. TYRUS RAYMOND COBB and to secure his assistance to the San Francisco Field Division and furnish information concerning individuals associated with organized baseball.

This is to advise that Mr. COBB was interviewed on June 5, 1942, by Special Agent this office, at which time Mr. COBB stated he will give his wholehearted cooperation to the Bureau in any way that the Bureau deems advisable. Mr. COBB stated that he still maintains close contact with organized baseball, and makes trips to the East at irregular intervals during the baseball season to renew old acquaintances and to meet new stars in the baseball world.

Mr. COBB advised that he did not believe that there was any subversive element at work among the organized baseball players, and he stated that from his long study and observation that the baseball players and managers as a whole are a loyal and patriotic American group. He stated further that baseball players are very clammish, and that while they talk freely among themselves, the moment an outsider comes in the vicinity they become very secretive and resentful of any outside interference. He stated that he could not see how organized baseball as such he stated that he would not see how organized baseball as such he stated that he would bear the thought in mind henceforward and that in his trips to the eastern part of the United States during the coming season he would be vigilant for any type of subversive activity and would immediately advise the San Francisco Field Division should he detect such.

In conclusion Mr. COBB stated that he had nothing but the highest

PURPOSE:

To set forth data in Bufiles concerning Tyrus Raymond Cobl also known as "Ty" Cobb, who is to see the Director on the morning of January 28, 1954. It will be recalled that Mr. Cobb is the retired professional baseball player who is recognized as one of the immortals of the game.

DETAILS:

By letter of March 28, 1942, SAC N. J. L. Pieper, of the San Francisco Office advised that Cobb, who was then residing at Atherton, California, had reported several items of interest and val to the San Francisco Office in connection with internal security and espionage matters. Mr. Pieper stated that Cobb had advised that he and his associates and friends are "100% behind the FBI," and that they were very proud of the good work being done by the Bureau. Mr. Cobb stated that he had always felt that the Director and the FBI were beyond reproach. By letter of April 10, 1942, the Director sen: a personal letter to Mr. Cobb thanking him for his assistance and for his commendatory remarks about the Bureau.

By letter of January 25, 1942, SAC Pieper, advised that Mr. Cobb was being listed as a Special Service Contact of the San Francisco Office (94-4-5663)

By letter of June 12, 1943, SAC Pieper stated that Mr. Cobl was being carried as an inactive Special Service Contact inasmuch as he was not in a position to furnish anything of value to the San Francisco Office at that time. (67-045-149)

In the early 1940's the Bureau conducted an investigation of one individual was described to being and he was reported as being extremely pro-wazi in sympathy. investigation was closed in 1945 after an interview with the subject failed to substantiate pro-Nazi activities and indicated that he might be "mentally unbalanced from drink." The investigation also failed to reflect that there was and between the subject and Tyrus Raymond Cobb failed to reflect that there was any active connection or association



Throughout the course of the tour, Mr. Cobb made many highly commendatory remarks concerning the Bureau and the Director and stated that his meeting with the Director yesterday morning ranked as one of the greatest thrills of his life. 
